MEF President Says Employers Shouldn't Disclose Salary in Job Ads, Whole of M'sia is Not Having it!

The Malaysian Employers Federation (MEF) believes that employers should not have to openly state their salary schemes. MEF President, Datuk Dr Syed Hussain Syed Husman shared that this is because salaries are classified as confidential and should not be displayed to the public.

According to a report by [Buletin TV3](#), this comes after Muar MP Syed Saddiq proposed that the government enact the Salary Advertisement Act, so that employers are required to advertise salary scales for the jobs they are offering.



“It is therefore feared that the proposal to enact a law requiring employers to display the salary range in job advertisements will be seen as unfriendly to investors.”

“In addition, it will also make it difficult for the country to reach the top 12 in world competitiveness in the next 10 years,” Datuk Dr Syed Hussain said.
